

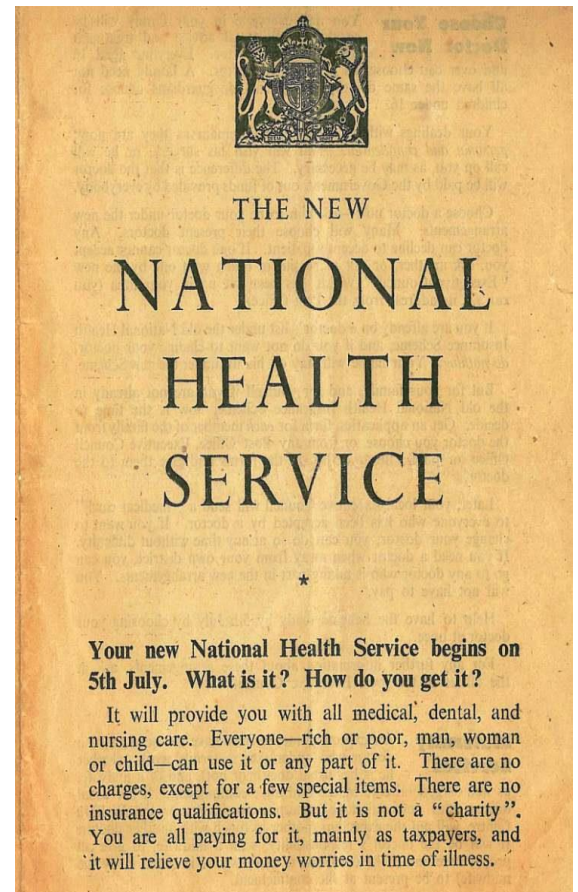
A vote for Stewart is a vote to SAVE the NHS
